CODE OF CONDUCT

This Code of Conduct sets out the basic standard of conduct expected of all attendees, Staff, & Volunteers while at this conference. By attending this conference, you are expected to abide by this conduct to keep yourself and everyone around you safe.

ONE: Be patient and courteous.

Be inclusive. This space welcomes & supports people of all backgrounds and identities. This includes but is not limited to members of any sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, race, ethnicity, culture, national origin, social and economic class, educational level, colour, immigration status, sex, age, size, family status, political belief, religion, and mental and physical ability.

TWO: Be considerate.

We all depend on each other to ensure that we get the most out of this leadership summit. Your decisions will affect each other, and you should take those into account when making decisions.

THREE: Be respectful.

We won't all agree all the time, but disagreement is no excuse for disrespectful behavior. An environment where people feel uncomfortable or threatened is not a productive or creative one.

FOUR: Choose your words carefully.

Always conduct yourself professionally. Be kind to others. Do not insult or put down others. Harassment and exclusionary behavior aren't acceptable.

SIX: Repeated harassment of others.

In general, if someone asks you to stop doing something, then stop. When we disagree, try to understand why. Differences of opinion and disagreements are mostly unavoidable. What is important is that we resolve disagreements and differing views constructively.

SEVEN: Our differences can be our strengths.

We can find strength in diversity. Different people have different perspectives on issues, and that can be valuable for solving problems or generating new ideas. Being unable to understand why someone holds a viewpoint doesn't mean that they're wrong. Don't forget that we all make mistakes and blaming each other doesn't get us anywhere. Instead, focus on resolving issues and learning from mistakes.

EIGHT: Respect the Space.
